Much of what we say to others is communicated not only through words, but also through body language, this includes our posture, facial expression, and gestures. Because body language plays such a significant role in communication, it's important to know what your body is telling other people. You should also know how to interpret other people's body language. Here are some examples of typical body language. A smile is usually a sign of friendliness and interest. However, some people smile just to be polite. To get another clue from people's faces, notice how they use their eyes. Friendliness and interest are expressed when a person's eyes meet yours directly. If someone looks away for a moment and then back again the person is probably paying attention to what you are saying. If this person continues to look away while you're talking, he might not be interested, or could be shy. People also use hand gestures during a conversation to describe the size of something or the way someone acted. Finally, be aware that when someone keeps pointing at you while talking, it could mean the person is angry or feels superior in some way.
