Studies show that rapid increase in population growth creates problems for developing countries. So why don't people have fewer children? The information collected from the developed countries suggests that it is only when people's living standards begin to rise that birth rates begin to fall. There are good reasons for this.

Poor countries cannot afford social services and old age pensions – the money they get from the government when they become old and can't work – and people's incomes are so low they have nothing to save for the future.
