No one knows who invented pencils or when it happened. A Swiss described a pencil in a book in 1565. He said it was a piece of wood with lead inside it (lead is a very heavy, soft, dark gray metal). Pencils weren't popular and people continued to write with pens. They used bird feathers as pen. Then in 1795, a person started making pencils from graphite. Graphite is something like coal (coal is black and we burn it for heat and energy). Today people make pencils in the same way. They grind the graphite, make it into the shape of a stick and bake it.
