PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE VS PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS



Present perfect simple: We use it when the result of the action is relevant, important.

Present perfect continuous: We use it to describe how somebody or something has been **occupying** their **time.** We also use it for actions which are incomplete or ongoing at the moment of speaking.
