# SECOND CONDITIONAL

Formation:

If + past simple, + would + base form

For Example: If I were you, I'd tell her.

IF	CONDITION	RESULT	SITUATION
	Past simple	Would + base form	
If	I had the time,	I would learn Italian.	Impossible I don't have the time, so I'm not going to learn Italian.
If	I won the lottery	I would travel around the world.	Unlikely There's a very small chance of winning the lottery, so the trip is unlikely

Past tense of "To be" verbs:

I, it, he, she + was → for **second conditional** and in a **formal** way, you can also use "were" instead of "was"


