Adjective: we use adjective to describe a person or a noun. Good-bad-tall-heavy-big-short-small Example: he is kind - they are tall students

Adverb: we use adverbs to describe an action or a verb.

Regular: badly- quickly- quietly- happily- carefully- sadly

Irregular: fast-fast hard-hard late-late good-well

Example: he drives slowly - they are walking fast

- Comparative: we use comparative to compare two people or two things.
- Comparative adjective:
- He is taller than his father.
- They are more/less famous than my brother.
- Comparative adverb:
- He walks more/less slowly. They drive more/less carefully.
- superlative: we use superlative to compare an one person or one thing to all. superlative adjective:
- He is the fastest student in class.
- They are the most important people in the country.
- superlative adverb:
- They drive the most carefully in his family.
