



An informal email (1)

In informal emails:

- use an informal phrase to begin your email: Hi ...,
 Hello ..., It's great to hear from you
- use short forms: it's, he's, I'll
- use informal words and expressions: Great!, loads of things, He's into ..., I guess ...
- use an informal phrase to end your email: Love, Write soon, Speak soon, See you soon





<u>Difference Between Formal</u> <u>and Informal Email</u>

Formal Email

Purpose

O The purpose is to sent important and business messages. Responses to queries, Sales & Marketing Proposals. Formal emails can be solicited or unsolicited

Informal Email

<u>Purpose</u>

- O The purpose is just to communicate or to message for having a informal meeting
- O They can be solicited however mostly they are unsolicited.





<u>Difference Between Formal</u> <u>and Informal Email</u>

Formal Email

<u>Audience</u>

- O Identifying the Audience is the most critical part of the Email. The whole structure & tone of the email depend on the target audience.
- For instance tone of email for assigning tasks to your staff is totally different then replying to complain of a customer.
- The target audience is work colleagues and business clients.

Informal Email

<u>Audience</u>

 The target audience is usually friends and family.



Formal Email

Subject Line

- O Subject line is like the Headline of a newspaper.
- Subject should be giving a basic idea about the purpose of email.

Informal Email

Subject Line

O No Particular subject required for informal email. However if the email is for a particular purpose it is better to replicate such purpose in the subject.





<u>Difference Between Formal</u> and Informal Email

Formal Email

Style & Accuracy

- Professionally formatted, Use of Paragraphs
- O The accuracy in spelling, punctuation and grammar is required. eg: Thank you for your response.

Informal Email

Style & Accuracy

- O Free from any style, normally very small messages are sent through such emails
- O The grammar and punctuation doesn't matters a lot. Eg:Thanx for ur email





<u>Difference Between Formal and</u> <u>Informal Email</u>

Formal Email

Opening & Closing

- There is proper beginning and ending pattern. Example : Dear Sir / Madam (beginning) and Yours respectively (ending)
- Message starts courteously and with a reference (where applicable)
- Closing with a courteous line and with signature of the sender
- O Contractions can not be use. How are you? Where are you?

Informal Email

Opening & Closing

- As such no pattern required.
- Opening informally with Hey or Hello
- Closing with first name or initials
- O Contractions can be used. How're you? Where're you?
