





They don't see the difference between male and female, not while they are out on the track doing what they enjoy the most.







Past progressive

 The past progressive refers to an action in progress during a particular time in the past. It is formed with was/ were + the -ing form of the verb.



Past progressive


I was playing video games all afternoon.

Where were you? We were waiting for hours!

I was running back to the hotel.

The wind was blowing.

The waves were crashing over our canoe.



The past progressive is often used with a when clause. This use draws attention to the idea of one action in progress interrupted by another past action. The simple past is used in the when clause.



Past progressive with when clause

- I was practicing the piano when the electricity went out.
- They were walking their dog when lighting struck a tree next to them.
- I was swimming when it began to rain.
- We were fishing when it suddenly got very windy.


