<p>singular nouns: add -'s <i>example: boy → boy's</i></p> 	<p>The boy's bicycle is blue.</p>  <p><i>It belongs to the boy.</i></p>
<p>plural nouns: add -s' <i>example: boys → boys'</i></p> 	<p>The boys' bicycles are blue.</p>  <p><i>They belong to the boys.</i></p>
<p>some irregular plural nouns: add -'s <i>example: children → children's</i></p> 	<p>The children's bicycles are blue.</p>  <p><i>They belong to the children.</i></p>
