

Nasir al-Mulk mosque



In 1876, **Mirza Hassan Ali Khan**, also known as **Nasir-Ol Molkthe** (ruler of Fars),

decided to build a mosque as a memory of himself for the next generations.

The designers of the mosque were **Mohammad Hasan-e-Memar**, an Iranian architect, and **Mohammad Reza Kashi-Saz-e-Širazi**. It was completed after 12 years in 1888.



But it didn't have any colored glasses at that time. They were added years later by
Haj Mirza Ayat



Nasir al-Mulk mosque is called “Mosque of colors,” the “Rainbow Mosque” and also the “Pink Mosque”.



This mosque is **unique** because of the **pink color** that is used in the structure.

It doesn't have a dome because it was a personal property.

When sunlight passes through mosaic windows, it creates hundreds of colors on the walls and floor carpets.
