

# **AT THE RESTAURANT**



## **1. Are you ready to order?**

A: Waiter! I'd like the menu, please. W: Here you are, sir. W: Are you ready to order? A: Yes, I am. Can I start with tomato soup? Then the salmon and steak, please. W: What steak would you like: rare, medium or well - done? A: Medium, please. W: And would you like vegetables or salad? A: Vegetables, please. W: Would you like any wine? A: Yes, white, please..... A: Waiter! Can I have the bill, please? W: Here you are. A: Is service included? W: Yes, it is. A: Can I pay by credit card? W: Yes, of course.

### Table manners. How not to behave badly abroad
