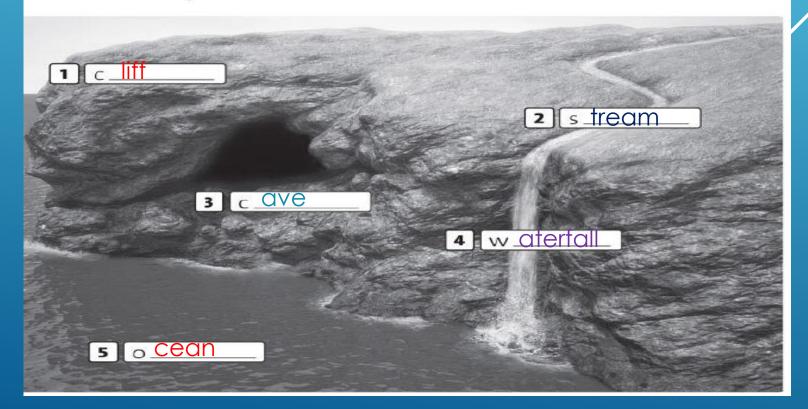
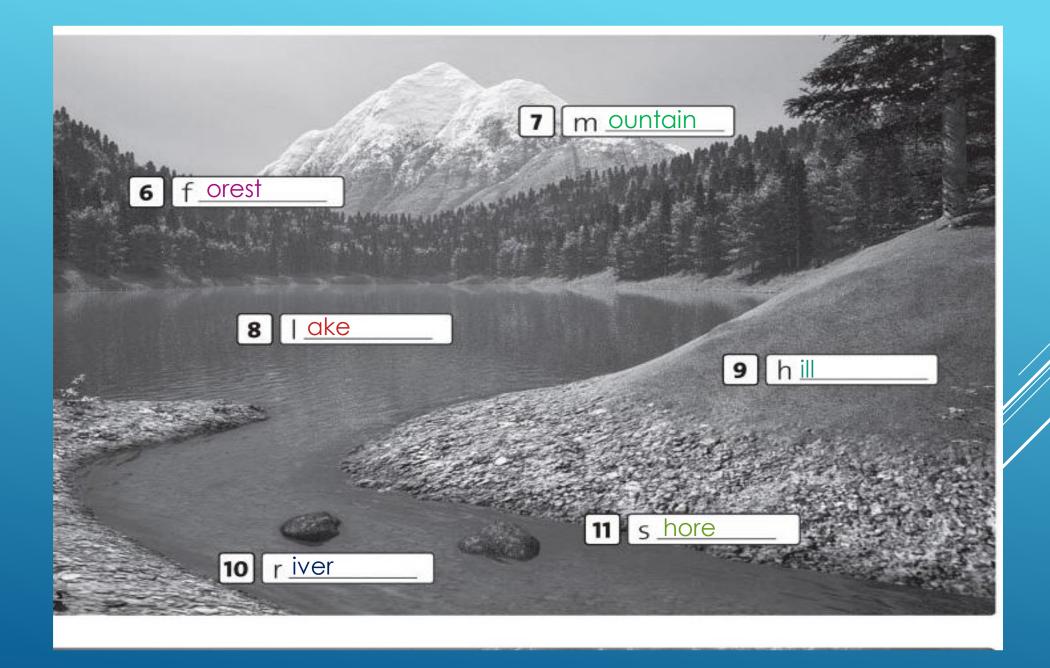

BASE jumping is an extreme sport. It is 1\_\_\_\_ to skydiving, but there are important differences. Firstly, the jumps are much lower – usually no more than six hundred metres. 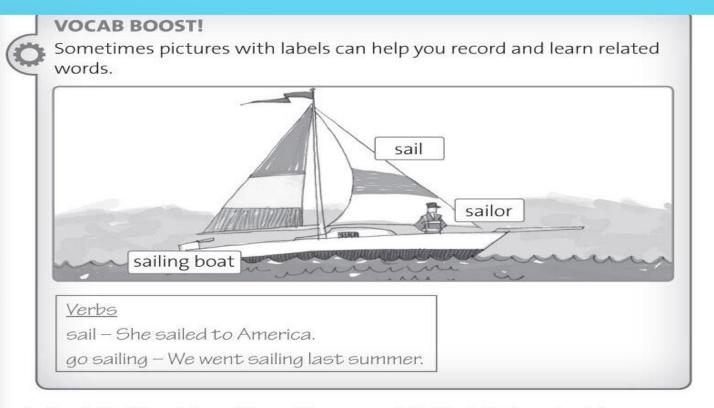

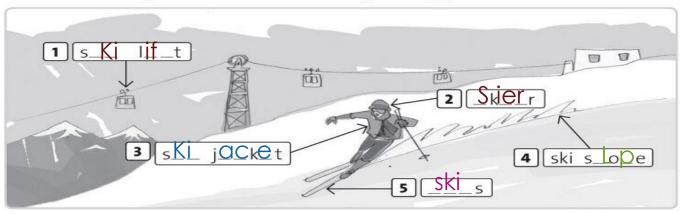

- On 29 January 1982, Steven Callahan left the Canary Islands in a small yacht.

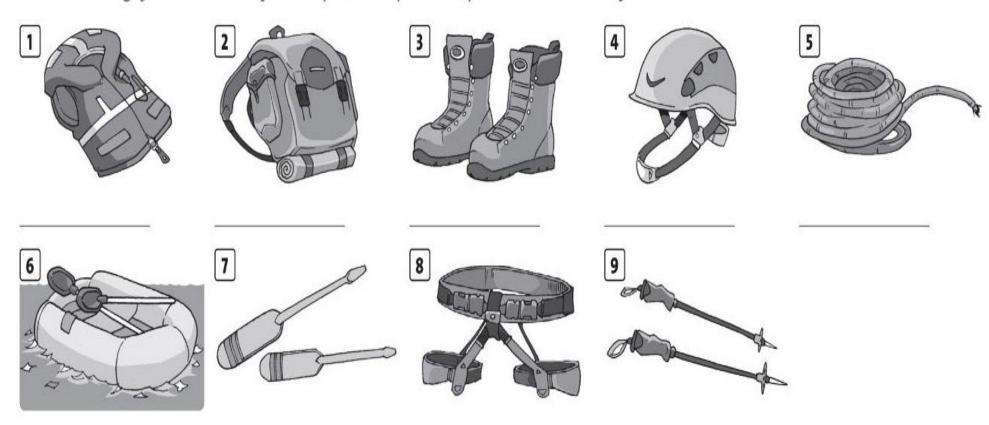
