Nasir al-Mulk mosque



In 1876, Mirza Hassan Ali Khan, also known as Nasir-Ol Molkthe (ruler of Fars),

decided to build a mosque as a memory of himself for the next generations.

The designers of the mosque were Mohammad Hasan-e-Memar, an Iranian architect, and Mohammad Reza Kashi-Saz-e-Širazi. It was completed after 12 years in 1888.



But it didn't have any colored glasses at that time. They were added years later by Haj Mirza Ayat



Nasir al-Mulk mosque is called "Mosque of colors," the "Rainbow Mosque" and also the "Pink Mosque".



This mosque is unique because of the pink color that is used in the structure.

It doesn't have a dome because it was a personal property.

When sunlight passes through mosaic windows, it creates hundreds of colors on the walls and floor carpets.
