We use it with Countable nouns in the plural and with uncountable nouns.

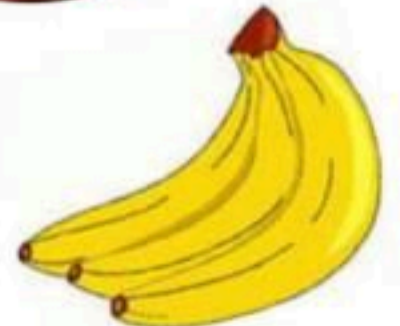
