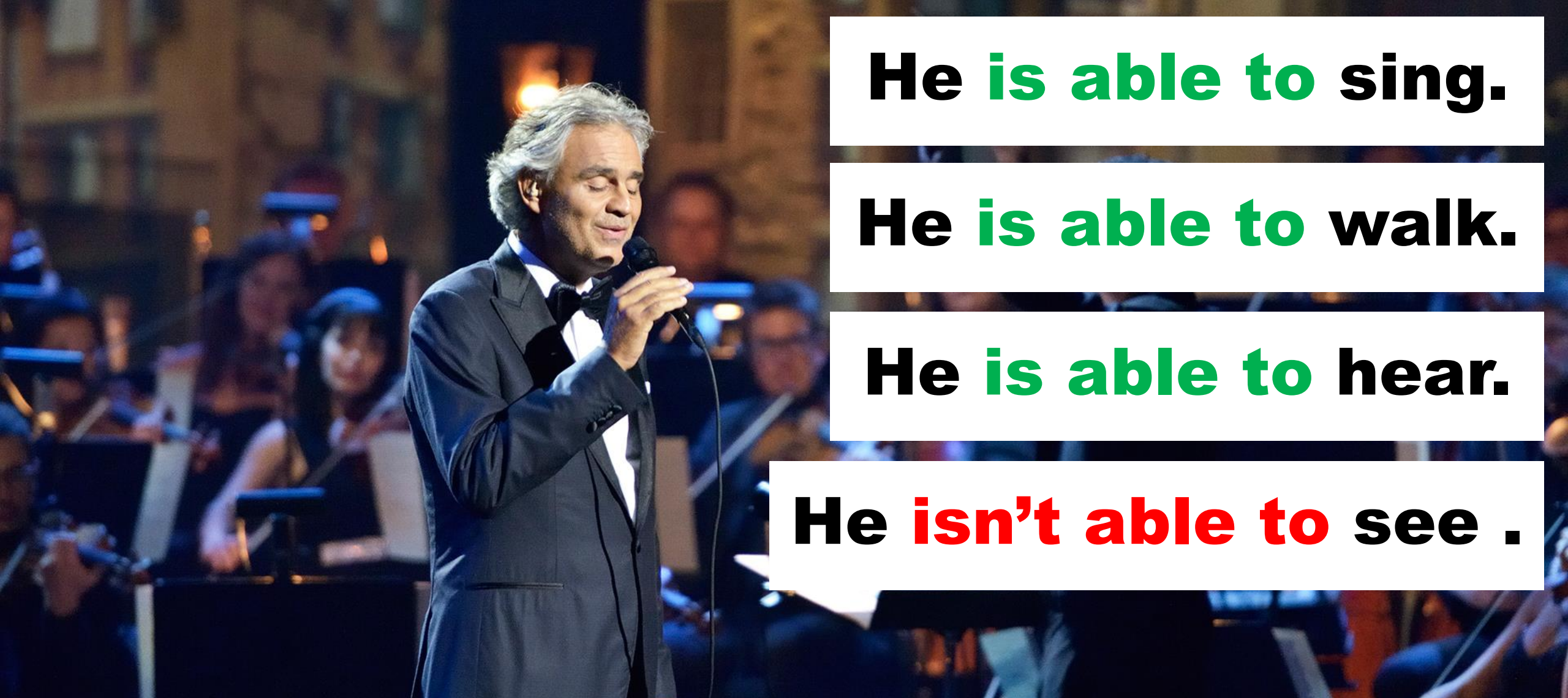

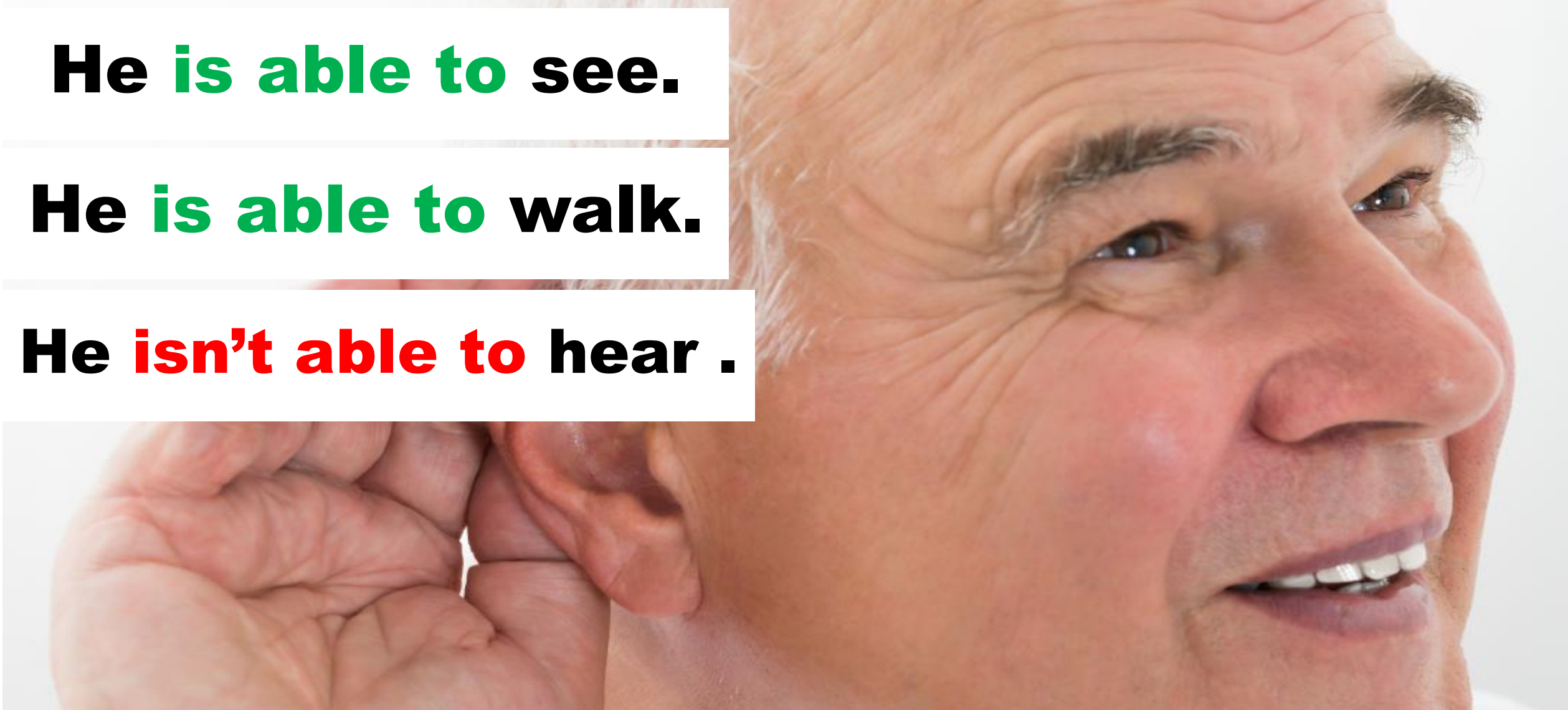
He isn't able to see .
