Truth or lie



Cheat: act dishonestly or unfairly in order to gain an advantage. "she always cheats at cards"

Deceive: deliberately cause (someone) to believe something that is not true, especially for personal gain.

"I didn't intend to **deceive** people **into** thinking it was French champagne"

Disguise: give (someone or oneself) a different appearance in order to conceal one's identity.

"we took elaborate measures to disguise ourselves as locals"

distort: give a misleading or false account or impression of. "many factors can distort the results"

Exaggerate: represent (something) as being larger, better, or worse than it really is.

"he was apt to exaggerate any aches and pains"

Fabricate: invent (something) in order to deceive. "officers fabricated evidence"

fib: a lie, typically an unimportant one. "why did you tell him such a dreadful fib?"

fool: trick or deceive (someone).
"he **fooled** nightclub managers **into** believing he was a successful businessman"

lie: to make an untrue statement with intent to deceive: She was lying when she said she didn't break the vase.

Make an excuse: to give a reason for doing something you shouldn't do, or for not doing something you should do.

Manipulate: to control or influence someone or something, often in a dishonest way so that they do not realize it manipulate somebody/something She uses her charm to manipulate people. As a politician, he knows how to manipulate public opinion.

Mislead: cause (someone) to have a wrong idea or impression. "fans believed they were misled about the reasons for the cancellation"

own up: admit to having done something wrong or embarrassing. "if whoever did it owns up I promise I won't punish them".

Pass sth/sb off as: to cause people to wrongly believe that someone or something is someone or something else amateurs passing themselves off as professionals She passed the poem off as her own.

Photoshop: alter (a photographic image) digitally using Photoshop image-editing software.

"the pictures have obviously been Photoshopped"

reveal: make (previously unknown or secret information) known to others.

"Brenda was forced to reveal Robbie's whereabouts"

Swear: make a statement or promise undertaking to do something or affirming that something is the case.

"Maria made me swear I would never tell anyone"

biased: unfairly prejudiced for or against someone or something. "we will not tolerate this biased media coverage"

Hypocritical: behaving in a way that suggests one has higher standards or more noble beliefs than is the case.

"we don't go to church and we thought it would be hypocritical."

Manipulative: exercising control or influence over a person or situation.

"she was selfish and manipulative"

Unethical: not morally correct.

"it is unethical to torment any creature for entertainment"
