How much do you know about Agatha Christi?








Agatha Christie was a British author who wrote many '<u>mystery</u> novels. She was born in 1890 in Torquay, which is a town in ² England.

As a young girl, Agatha loved writing stories for her family . When she was sixteen, Agatha went to school in Paris, where she ⁴ studied music. Agatha sold her first novel in 1920. It was about a Belgian ⁵ detectives During her life, she <u>wrote</u> more than 72 novels.

Some of Agatha's stories have become ⁷ <u>films</u>, like her famous novel *Death on the* * <u>Nile</u>. When Agatha died in 1976, she was 86 years old.
