- Mona Lisa is owned by the French government and is put on display at Louvre Museum.
- In 2022, an old man went to the museum and smeared cake all over the Mona Lisa. The painting was not damaged because it is protected by a bulletproof glass. The man said he wanted to attract people's attention to 'the climate change'.
