

Guernica is a world-famous painting by Spanish artist Pablo Picasso in 1937. It is one of the world's greatest anti-war paintings. It is a very large painting (a mural) which shows the bombing of the Spanish city of Guernica in 1937 during the Spanish War. It shows how people, as well as animals, all suffer because of the tragedies of war.



Quick Facts:

- 🖌️ The Guernica is blue, black and white, 3.5 metre tall and 7.8 metre wide.
- 🖌️ There are some hidden images in the painting. If you look closely at the horse's teeth and nostril, you can see a skull. Also, a bull is formed from the bent leg of the horse.
- 🖌️ The painting is exhibited in Museo Reina Sofía in Madrid, Spain.
