square / rectangle



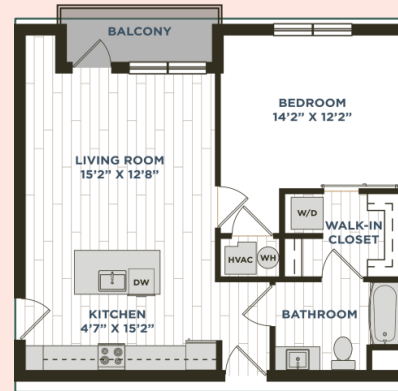

Add **walls** inside



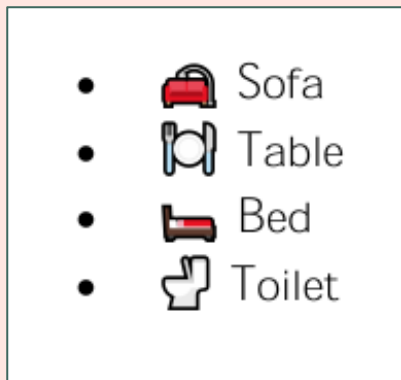

Windows



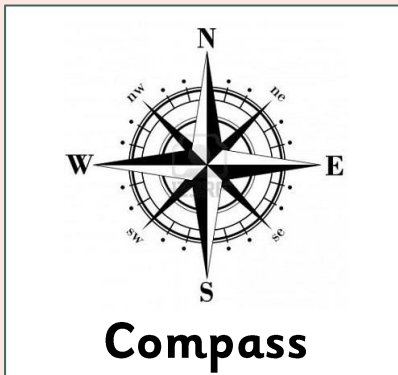

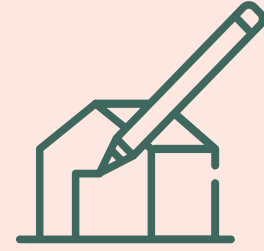

Keep it simple! 2-4 rooms is enough!



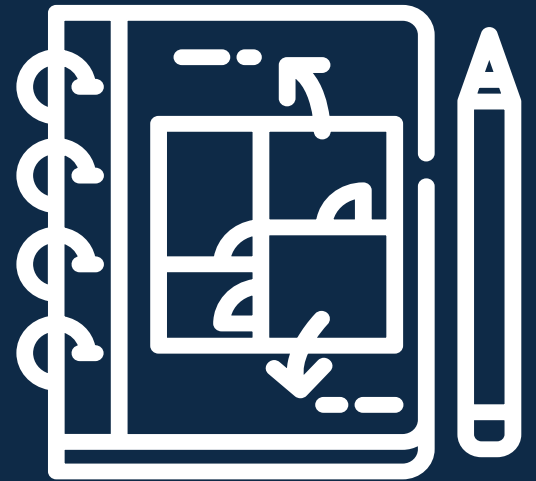
Use a ruler for clean lines.
