4. Minarets

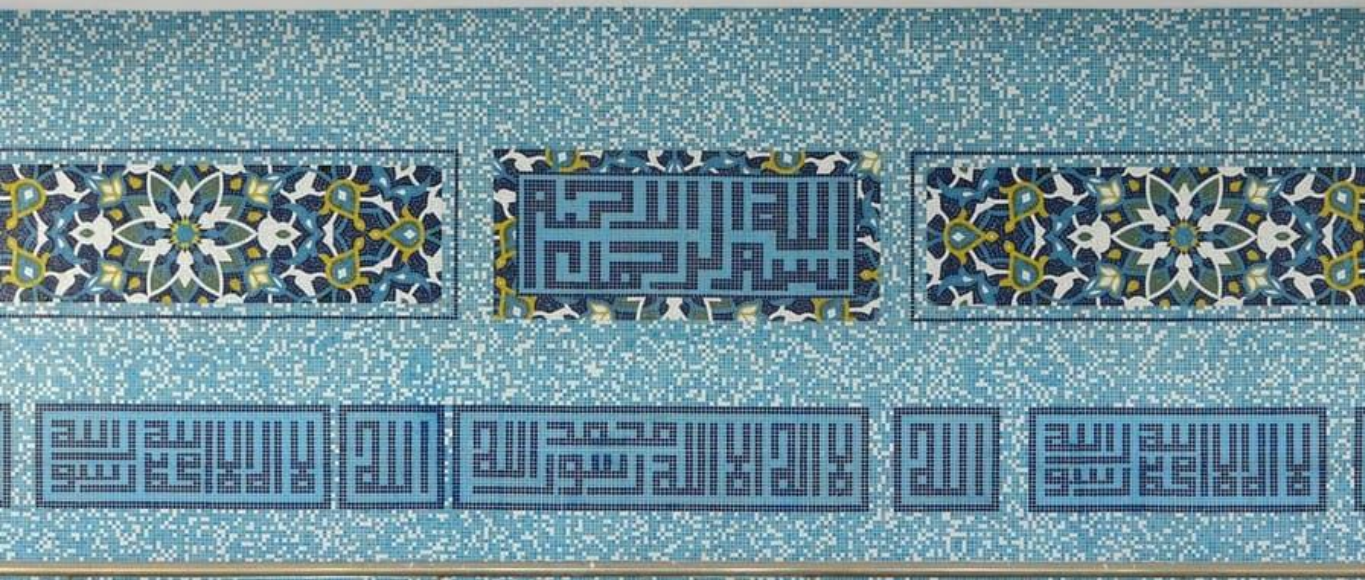
You can see these often in Iranian designs.

A large arched entrance or porch.

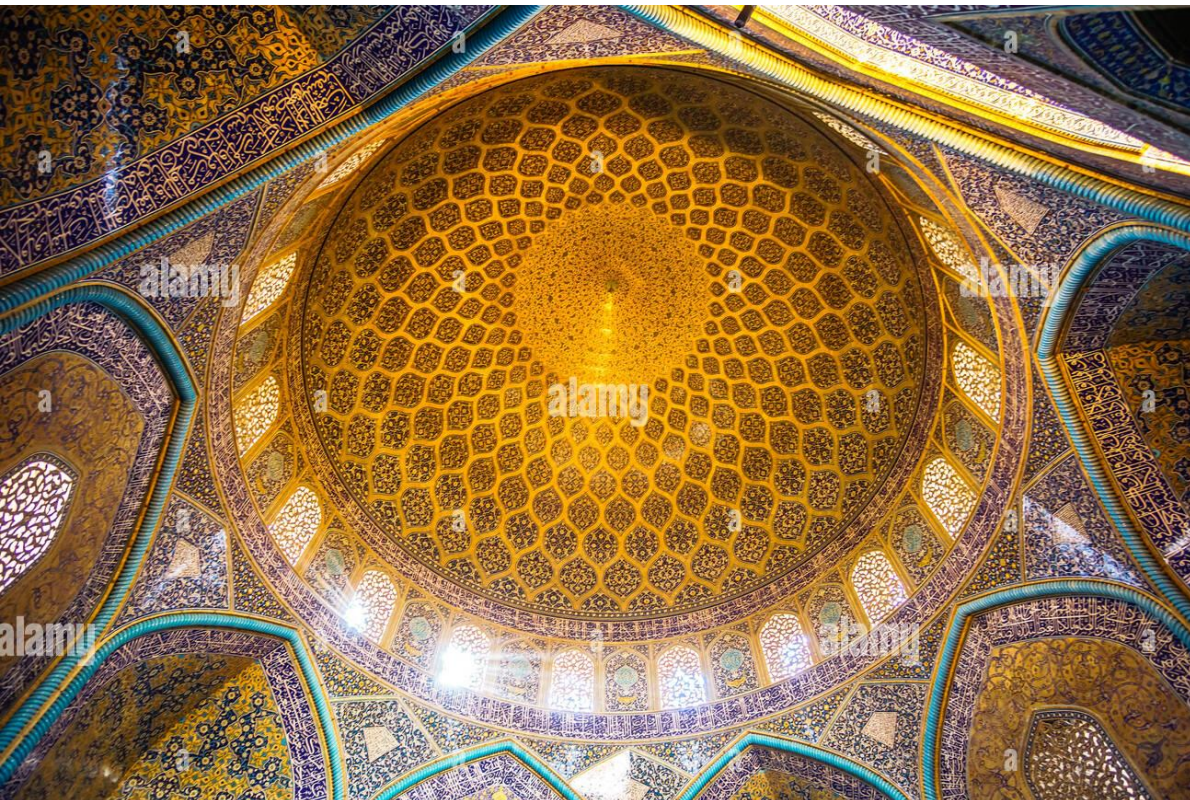


minarets:

Sometimes decorated inside with mirror mosaics.
