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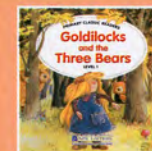
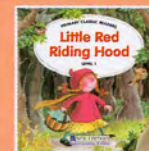
Pinocchio is the magical tale of the wooden puppet who becomes a boy, the lonely puppetmaker and Jiminy Cricket.

- an accompanying CD with each tale narrated by professional actors.

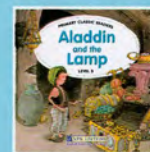

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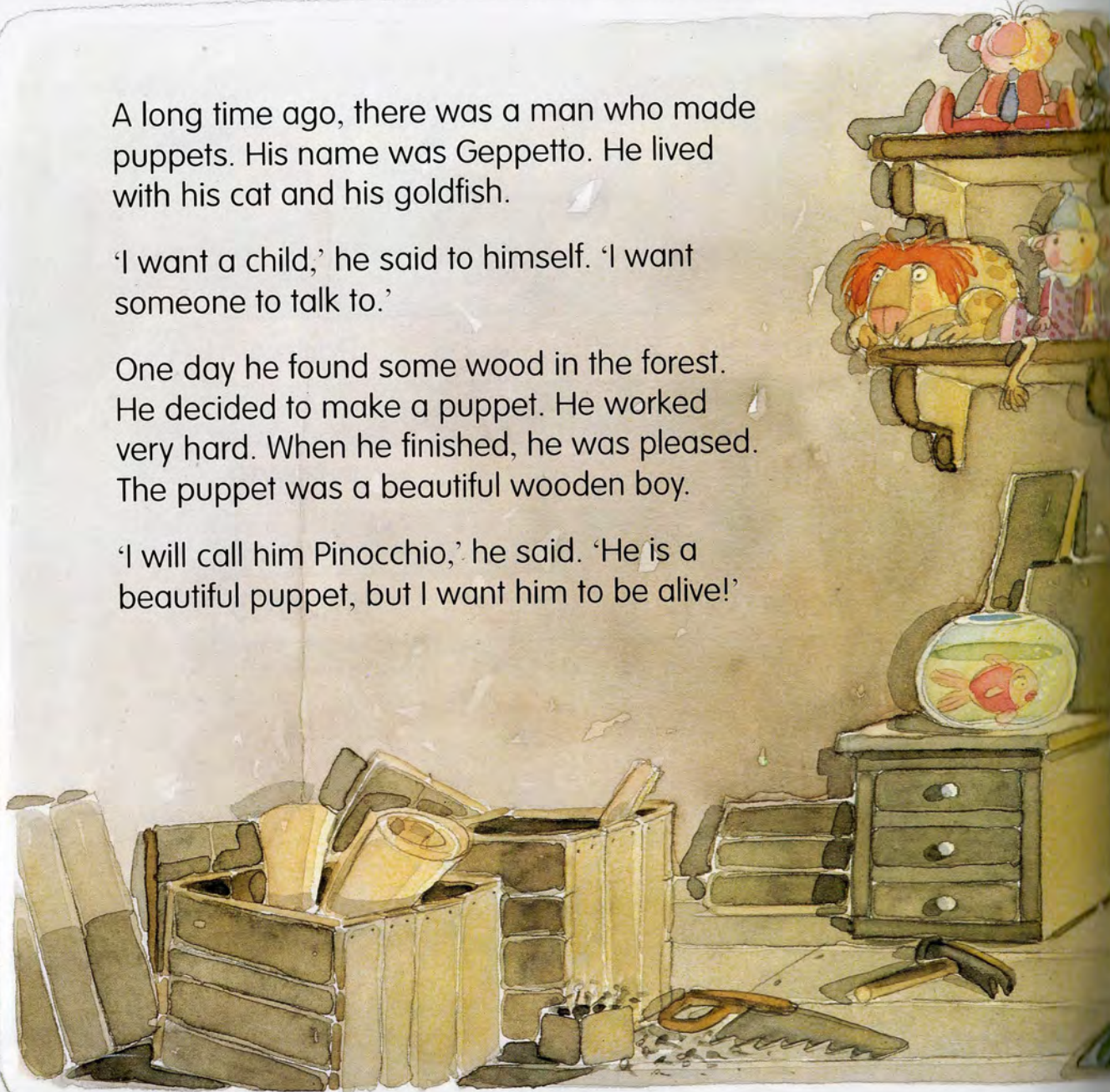


A long time ago, there was a man who made puppets. His name was Geppetto. He lived with his cat and his goldfish.

‘I will call him Pinocchio,’ he said. ‘He is a beautiful puppet, but I want him to be alive!’



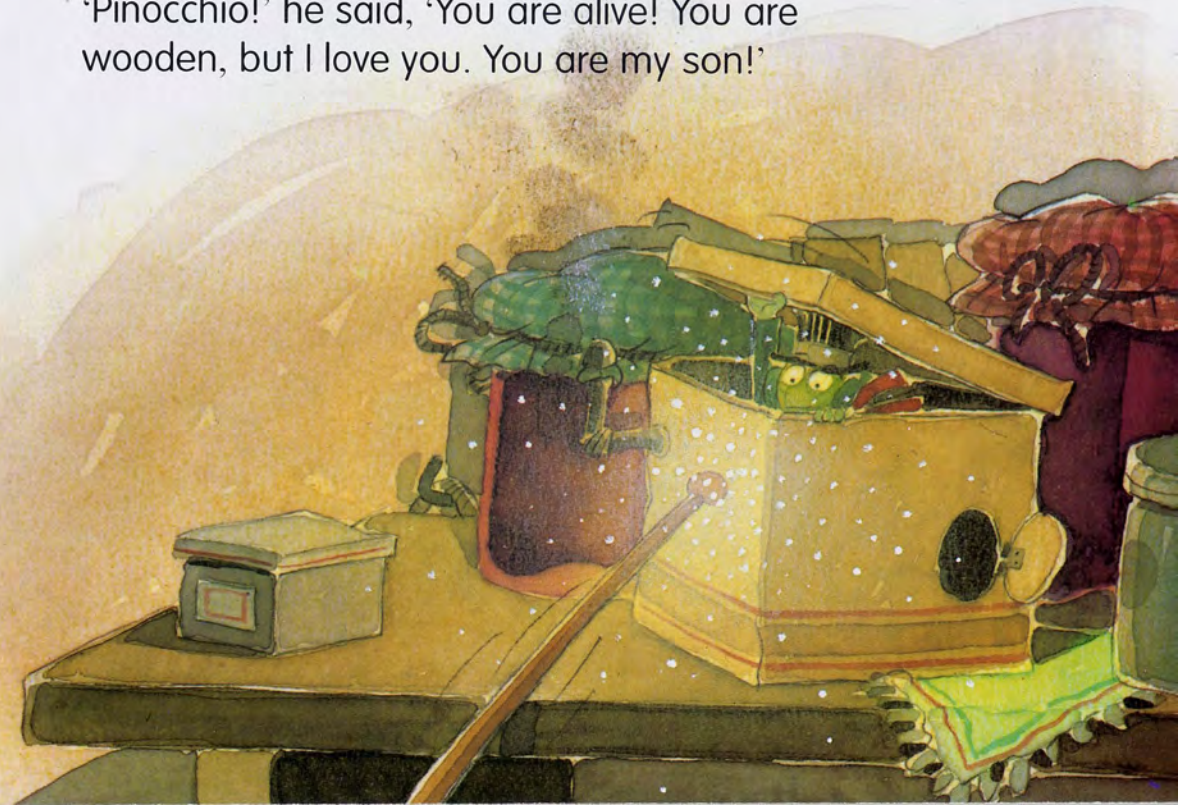

‘Why are you crying?’ asked a puppet.

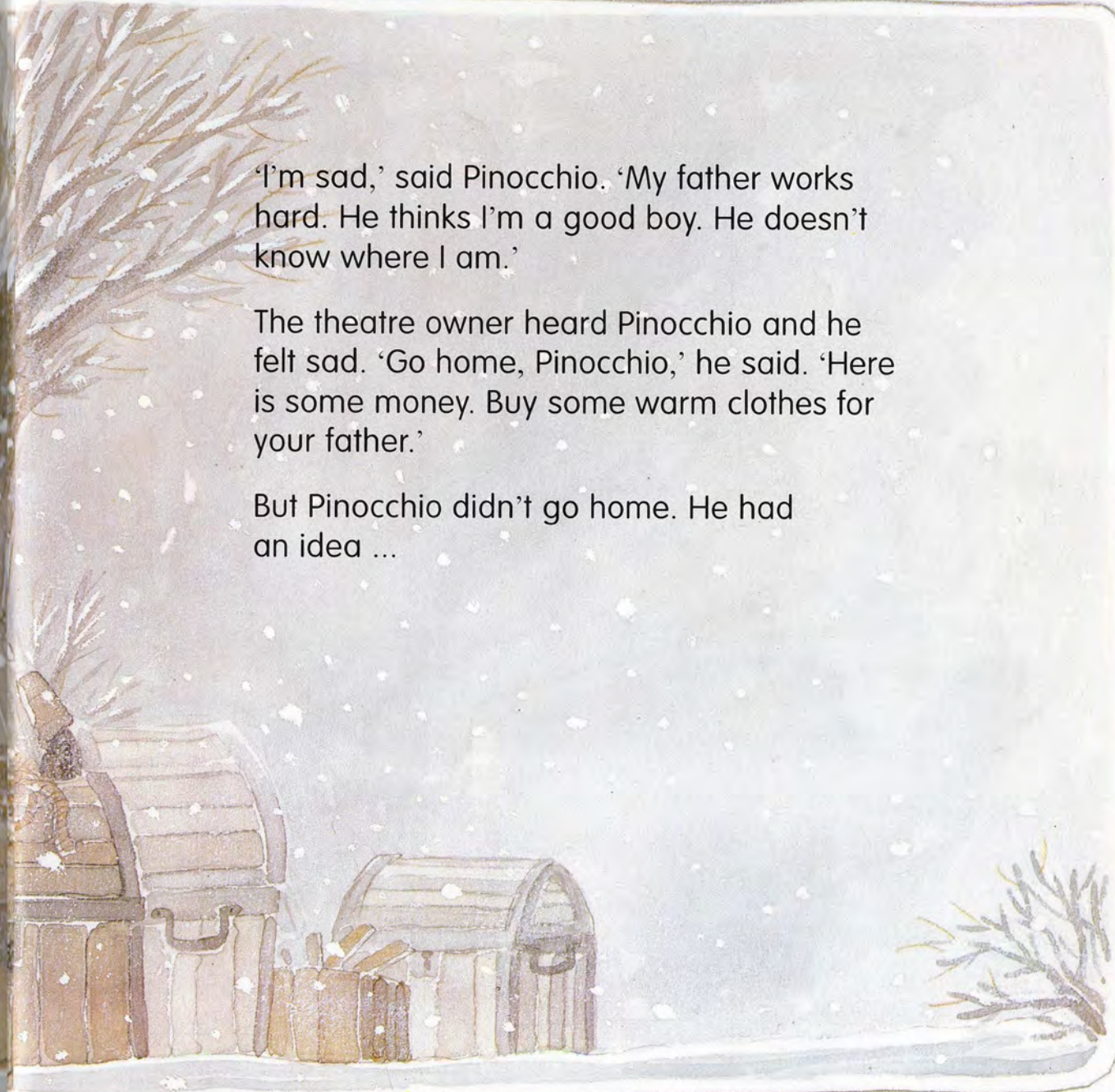




'I'm sad,' said Pinocchio. 'My father works hard. He thinks I'm a good boy. He doesn't know where I am.'

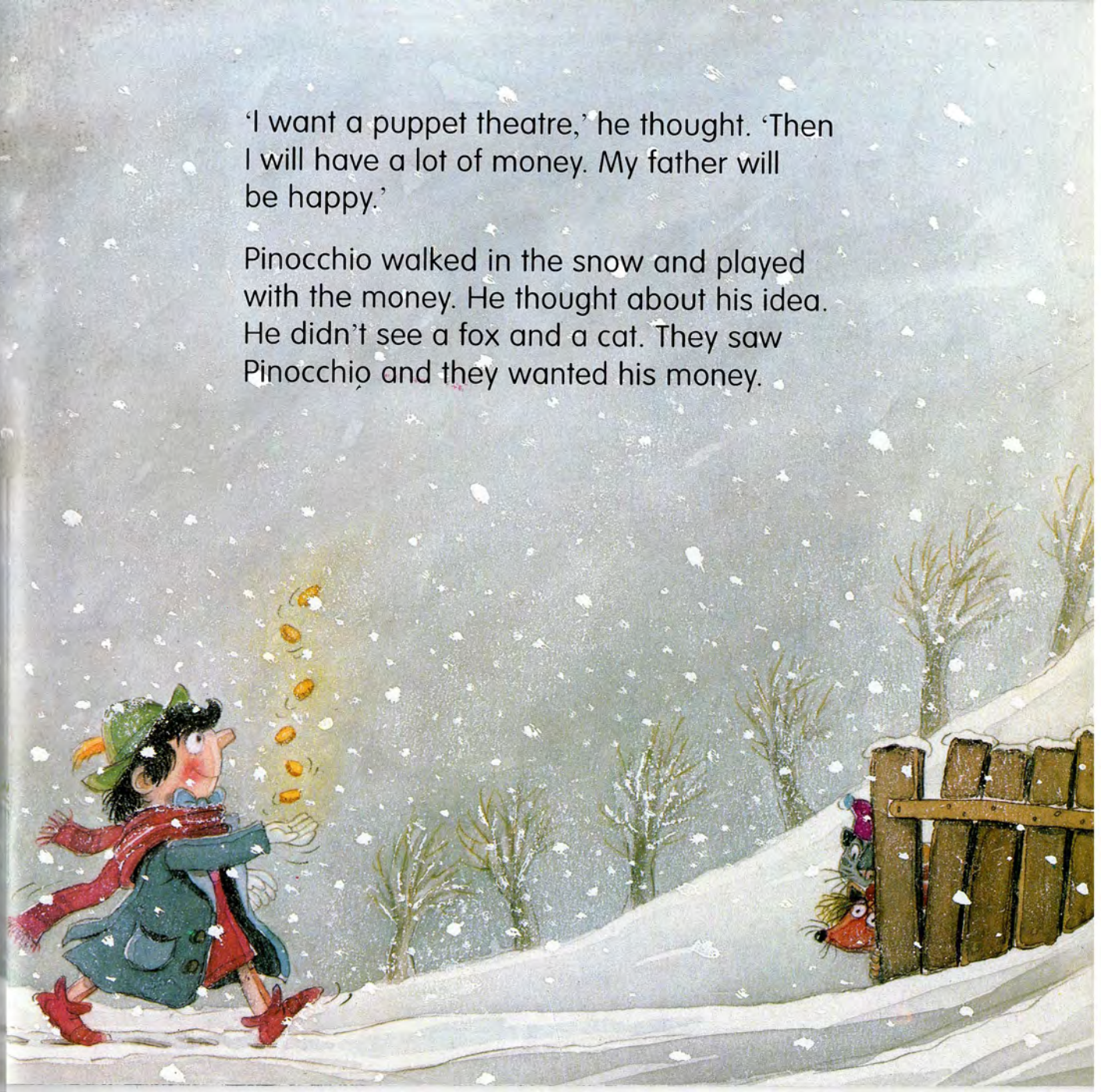
But Pinocchio didn't go home. He had an idea ...

‘Where are you going?’ asked Pinocchio.

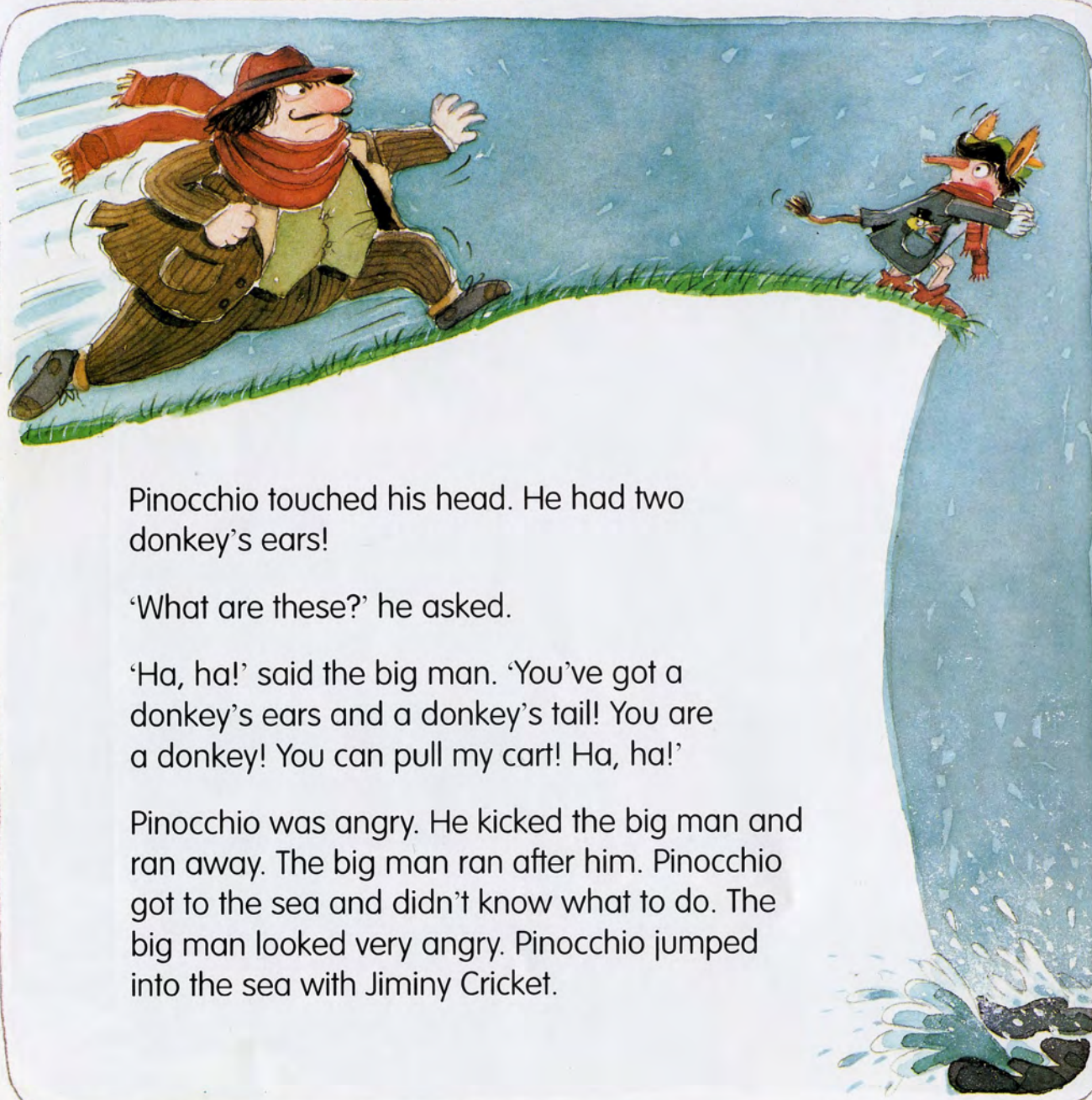
‘We are going to Playland!’ said the children. ‘We can play and dance all day. Come with us!’

'What are these?' he asked.

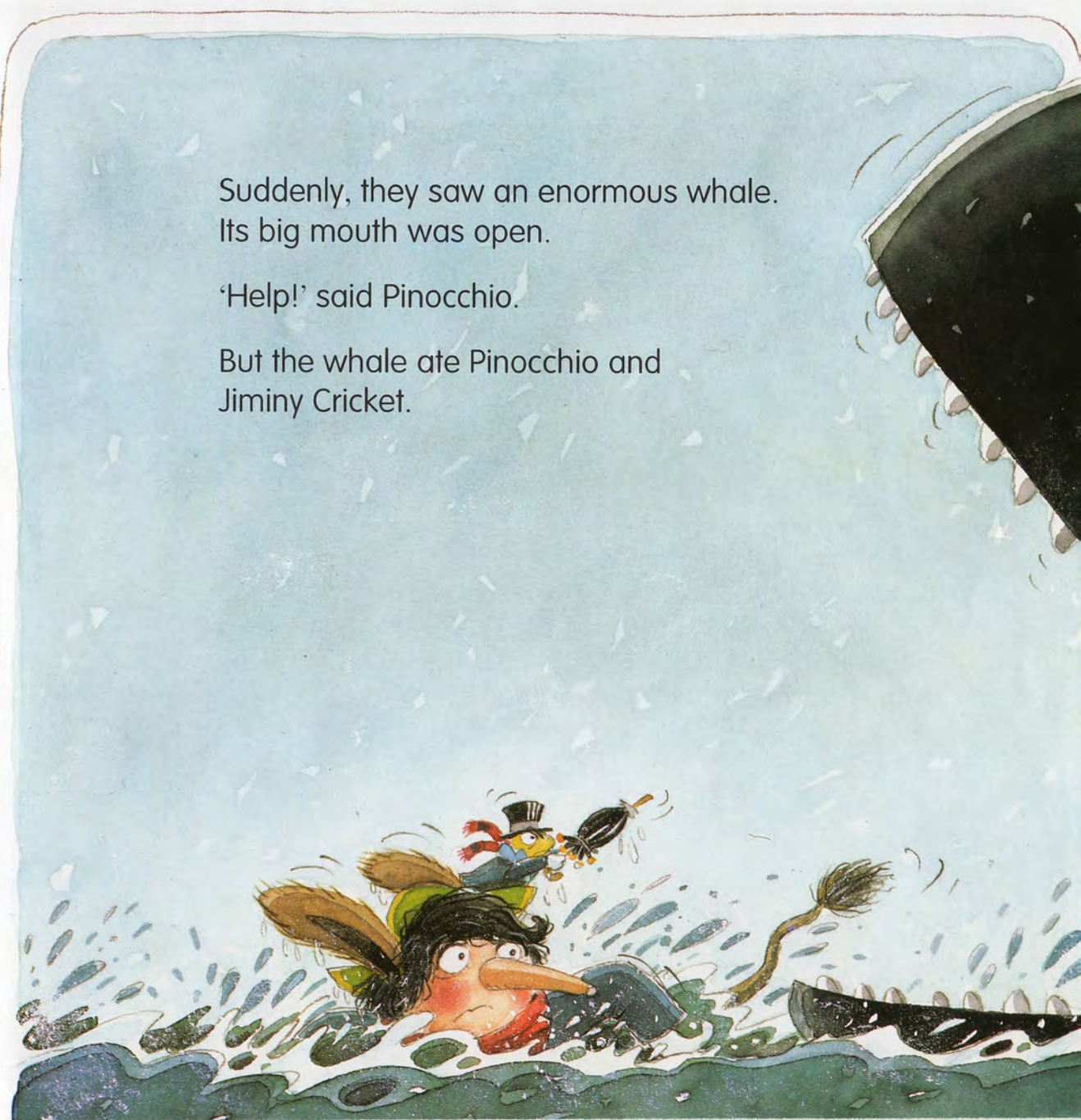
'Ha, ha!' said the big man. 'You've got a donkey's ears and a donkey's tail! You are a donkey! You can pull my cart! Ha, ha!'

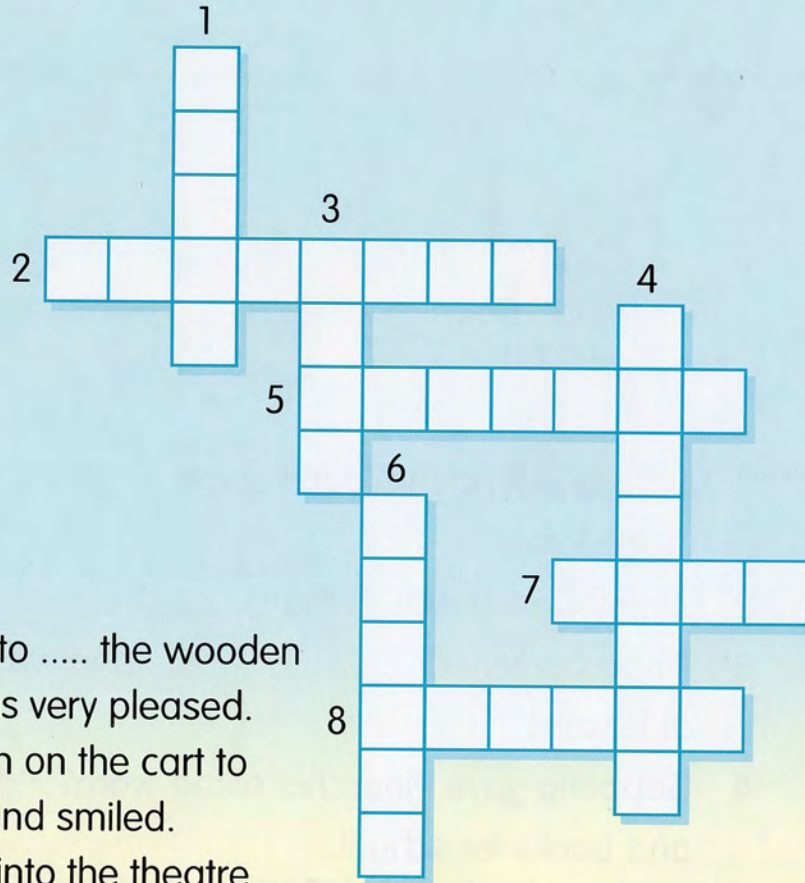

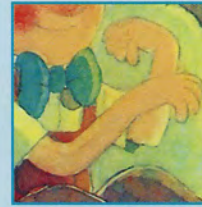
