Shopping for food

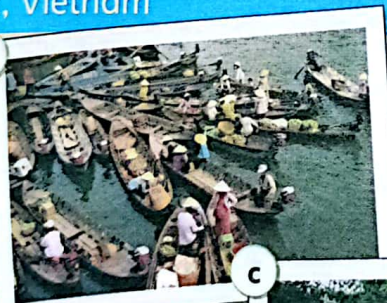
1 Bao's blog
