Equality is:

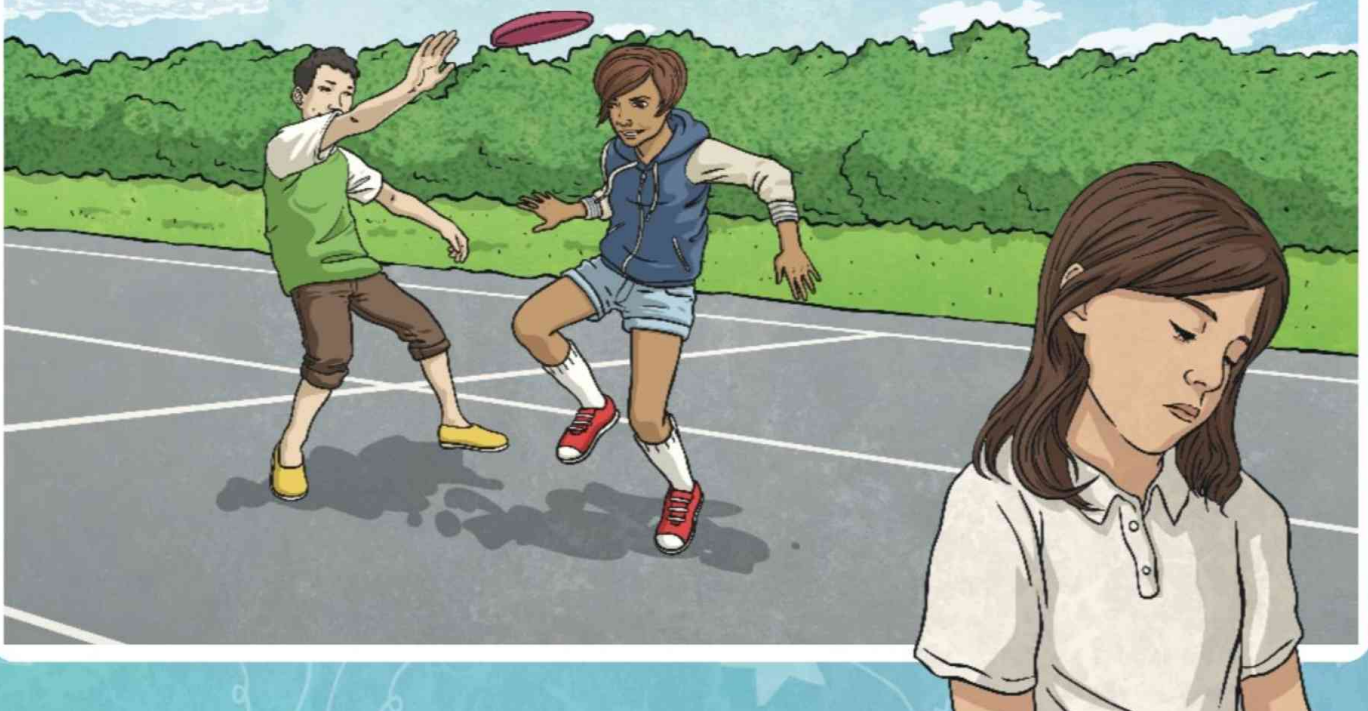
- ✓ understanding that everyone is different but that we are all people.

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What Is Discrimination?

Discrimination means to treat a person or a group of people unfairly, especially because of their differences, such as **race, religion, age, disability or gender.**

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What Does Discrimination Look Like?

Discrimination can take many forms. What might it look like?

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- Speaking unkindly about someone's skin colour, language, lifestyle, religion or disability.

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- Leaving someone out of a group or game because of who they are.

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- Picking people to play with because of what they look like or where they come from, not because of who they are inside.



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What Can We Do To Help?

If we see acts of discrimination like those we've just looked at, we can:

- talk to the person who is upset, showing kindness and respect;
- speak to a trusted adult;
- invite people to join our games, conversations and friendships.
